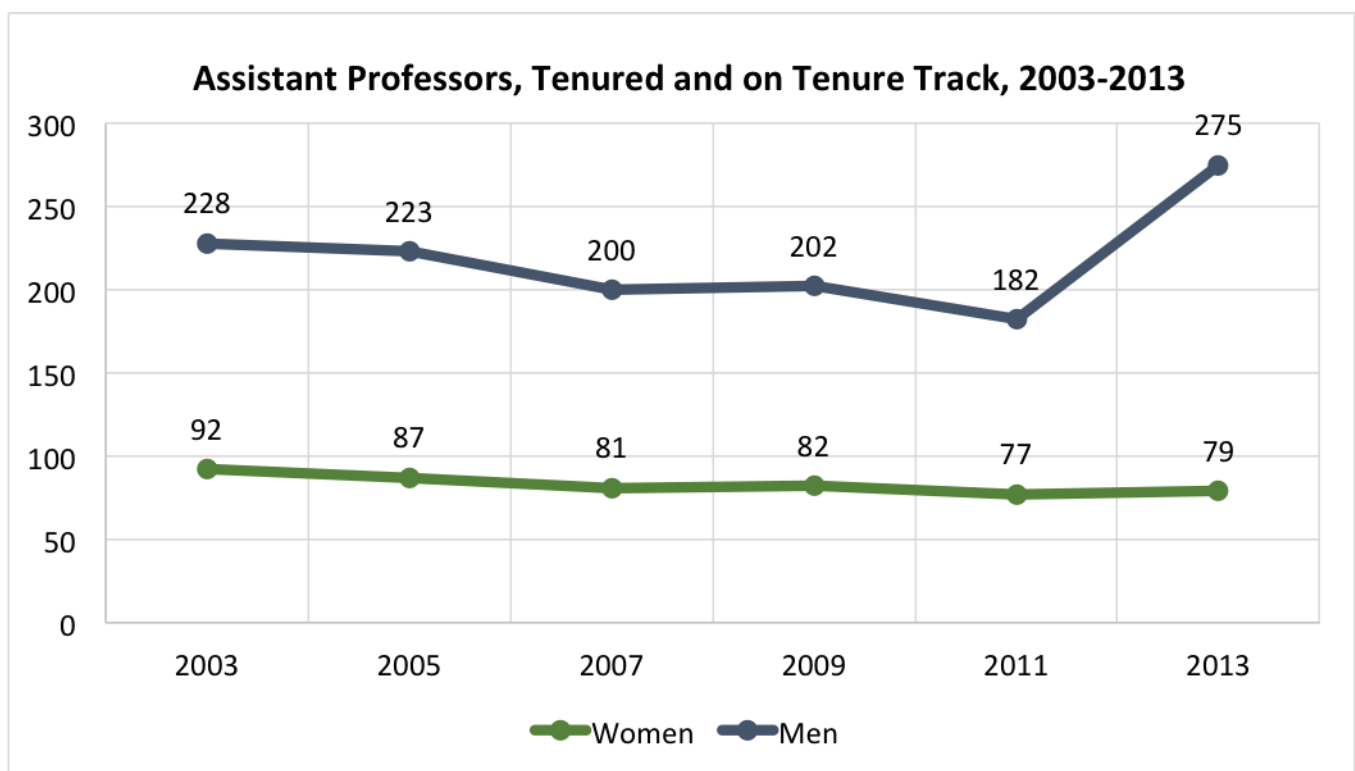

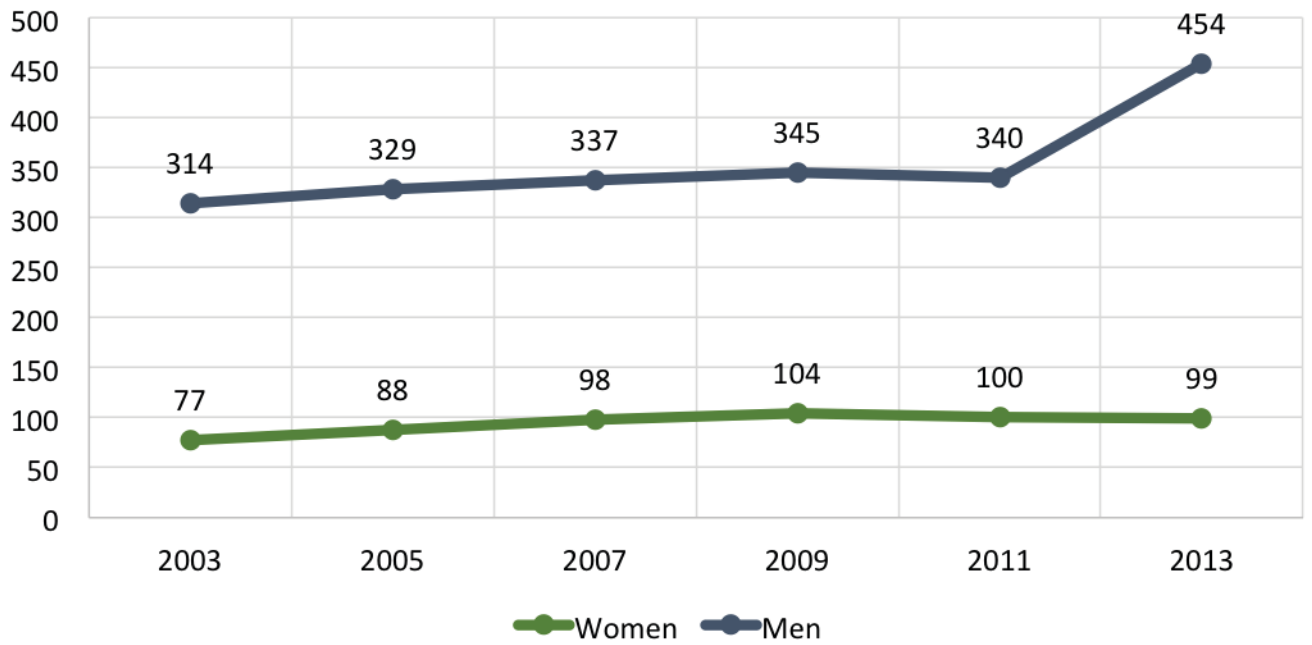
Advancing to Full Professor

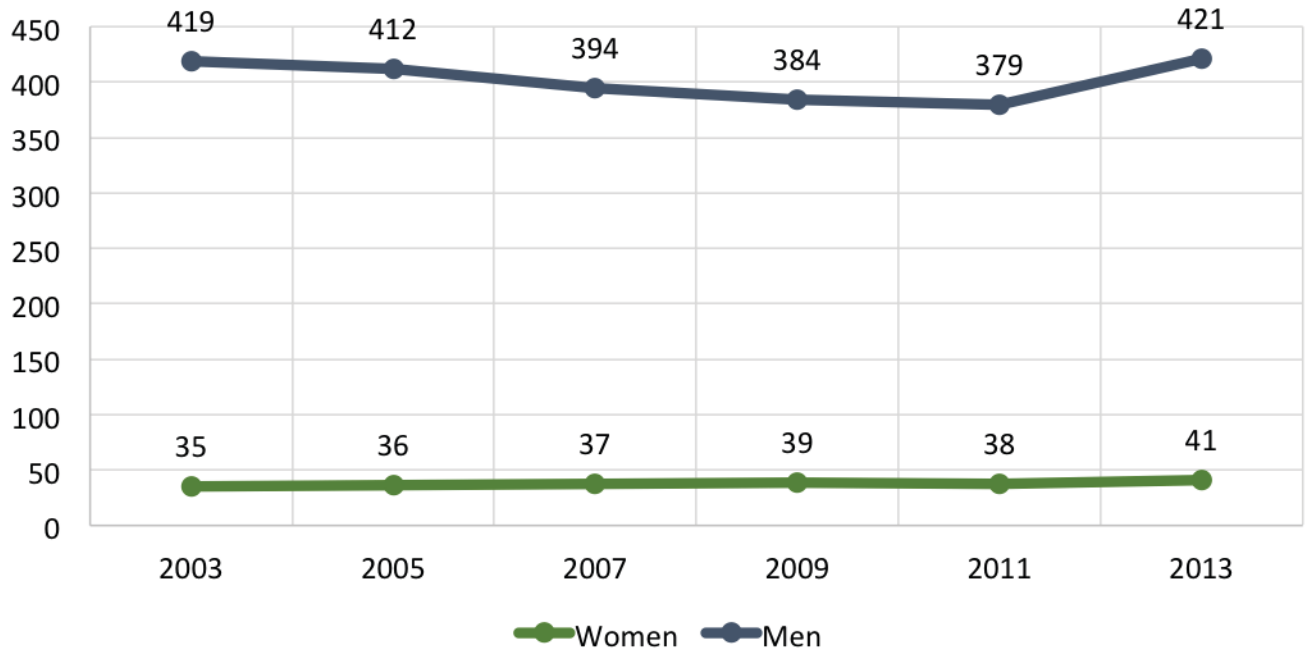
The graphs below represent the number of men and women at BYU who hold the rank of assistant, associate, and full professor in the years 2003 – 2013. Data was gathered from the National Center for Education Statistics' Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS; <http://nces.ed.gov/ipeds/>). All institutions that participate in any federal student financial aid program are required to submit data to IPEDS each year.

Research and Publishing Help

Pivot supports faculty who are searching for research grants. It features data on an estimated \$33 billion in research funding as well as researcher profiles. By setting up a profile in Pivot, you can receive automatic notices of funding opportunities that match your research interests. Pivot is available through the Harold B. Lee Library database portal or at http://pivot.cos.com/funding_main.

JANE – the Journal/Author Name Estimator (www.biosemantics.org/jane/) – is a free, web-based tool that suggests possible journals for publication based on an article's title and abstract. Produced by The Biosemantics Group, JANE compares keywords in your abstract to the last ten years of articles in MEDLINE to find journals, authors, or articles that match your query.
