The *YNews* and other publications highlight

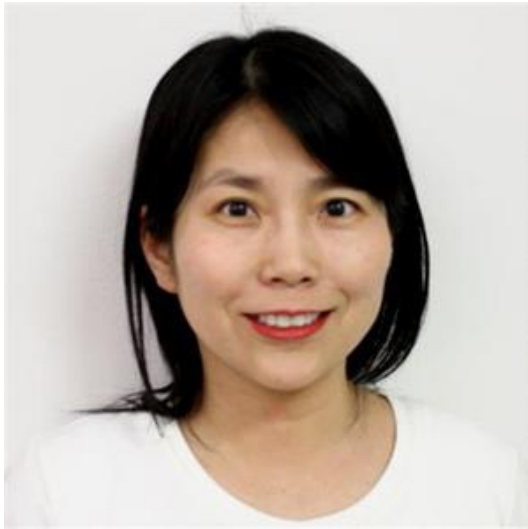


those contributions and provide evidence of the good that is being done here at BYU.
